### Beneficiary growth in the face of strikes, threats and intimidations

It is a fact that the whole world knows that Sri Lanka as a state is in an economic crisis. For that reason, various talks and discussions were held by priests related to Sri Lanka both within the country and around the world. Meanwhile, there was unrest among our countrymen. The reason for it was the sowing of hatred towards the ruler and the spread of agitations and violence based on that hatred. In such a background, what should be the fate of the people who earn daily income and the subsidized people also created a background that should be deeply considered. But in truth, we have to raise the question whether such a conversation or a study related to it or a sympathetic behavior towards them has become a science in our society.

Despite the situation, the government is maintaining the welfare of the subsidized beneficiary as usual. It is commendable work in every way. But, in view of the hardship faced by the country's economy, the hardship faced by the subsidy recipient and the daily wage earners must be taken into account. The vast majority of people affected by these strikes are the low-income earners and subsidy recipients whom we are targeting to discuss. Daily wage earners are especially affected. This is in the background of a special gazette announcement by the

President's Secretary making electricity supply, patient maintenance, feeding and care in hospitals, nursing homes or similar institutions an essential service.

These are some of the milestones where our society in Sri Lanka began to consciously write the history of strikes. If they are mentioned as years, they can be supported as 1891, 1893, 1923, 1929 and 1980. Among these, the strike of 1980 and the situation that everyone had to face after that have become topics that shock the society even today. It is indisputable that today's global economic background and the economic recession our country is facing is at a unique level compared to the times when all these strikes existed. If so, we must question the fairness of the harsh reality we are facing. In looking at some of our society who have launched a wave of racism even in the face of the Covid epidemic that the world has faced, it is clear that these racism and threats are all based on the narrow needs of the political elite. There is a vernacular reality that we need to understand as carefully as we are organized. That is, all these strikes are due to some party's political needs. The majority of those affected are subsidized beneficiaries and low-income earners who are engaged in daily jobs. The monthly wage earners and businessmen are living as they please, whether they are on strike or not. Even on strike day, their income does not decrease. Even so, the loss to the country and the society cannot be overestimated on Var Jana Day or in a few days. In calculations after the last month or year, the economic depression that the entire country has experienced is not insignificant.

Even though a thousand accusations are made for political reasons, and even if we set a path to achieve political victories, we should systematically look into how much impact these strikes have had on the betterment of the oppressed people. Apart from this, social awareness should be sharpened. The pressure and the result on the society based on any matter is determined by the nature and intensity of informing the society about that matter. As citizens, we take that path.
